**Clinical Studies:** Please note that interventional clinical trials, including feasibility studies or confirmatory interventional trials or observational studies with the primary aim to prove the efficacy of a therapeutic, diagnostic or prognostic method cannot be funded by the DFG within the NEURON framework.

### **Ethics regulations:**

All applicants conducting experiments in/with humans or human material have to submit an ethical approval and/or a positive vote from the relevant national or local ethics committee(s). If an ethics vote is required for the German or foreign part of the project, it must be submitted with the full-proposal. However, an ethics vote by the local German ethics committee can, as an exceptional case, be submitted no later than three months upon proposal submission. Otherwise, the funding organisations may stop processing the application. **Please note that the submission of a German ethics vote is also necessary if only the project part abroad is affected as it is a cooperation project.** German ethics committees can adopt the vote of the foreign ethics committee as its own.

### **Applicants with fixed-term contracts:**

The proposal must contain the information that the employment relationship is fixed-term and also indicate the date that it ends. An informal statement from the management of the institute confirming that the applicant will continue to be employed throughout the duration of the project is helpful.
